- The majority of the volume of berries and mushroom is picked by households. This table depicts the wild berry and mushroom volumes brought in for sale and income from picking.
- In peak years, the production of dried decorative lichen (reindeer lichen) is over 500,000 kg.
- The annual production of pit tar is about 50,000–100,000 litres, and its value varies between 250,000–500,000 €.
- Other natural products derived from the forests include the inner bark of pine, tar and charcoal as a by-product of tar-burning, and birch sap, birch bark and willow.
- Unit t means *metric ton*.
