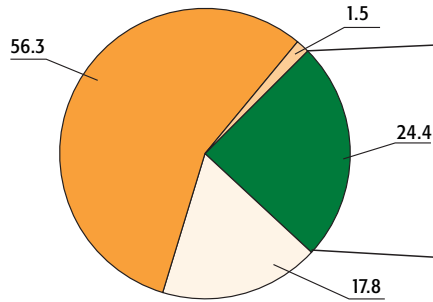
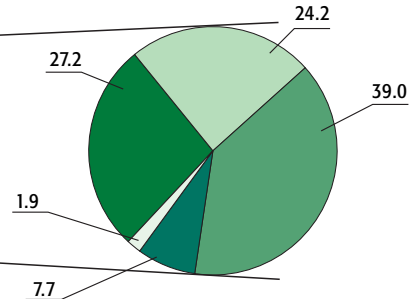


Felling methods, per cent of felled area

- Calculated as averages of figures from 1998–2002.
- Felling relying on natural regeneration includes fellings where seed tree and shelterwood are either left standing or later removed.
- The share of natural regeneration is 37% of the total regeneration area.
- In natural regeneration, seedlings grow naturally from the seeds of trees left as seed trees and of other trees.
- Forest cultivation means the setting up of a new forest by seeding or planting. Normally, the majority of trees even in cultivated forests are the result of natural regeneration.
